SUMMARY REPORT OF THE FOURTEENTH MEETING

HELD IN

STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN, June 7-11, 1971

PART A: COMMITTEE BUSINESS

1. GENERAL

1.1 Participants

The Chairman introduced Dr. M. Duret replacing Dr. E. Critoph for Canada, Mr. F.G. Dawson replacing Dr. P. Palermo for the USA and Dr. J. Berg the new Scandinavian representative who could not attend the Richland meeting. Dr. Motte was unable to participate in the meeting.

After the transfer of the responsibility for EACRP from the Scientific Division to the Technical Division, ENEA was represented by Mr. L.W. Boxer and Dr. J. Royen.

The observers from EANDC and IAEA were Dr. H. Condé and Dr. A. Spano, respectively.

The list of participants is given in Annex 1.

The Chairman raised the question whether the EANDC representative could attend the whole of the meeting and not only the technical part. This would be in line with the conditions valid for the EACRP representative at the EANDC meetings and it would allow matters involving EANDC to be taken up more efficiently at any of the two sessions.

The Committee agreed to let the EANDC representative participate in both sessions.

Küsters referred to the discussions at Richland about the need for a closer contact with CREST and asked whether a CREST observer should not be invited when topics related to CREST appeared on the agenda.

Boxer said that the Technical Division within ENEA now has the responsibility for both CREST and EACRP reducing the risk for conflicts of interest. The ENEA representative at the EACRP meeting will be familiar also with CREST and there should be no need for a special CREST observer.

Tyror supported Küsters' view and said that on occasions, depending on the items on the agenda, the technical discussions would benefit from the presence of a member of CREST.

Campbell recommended that the Committee should assume a flexible attitude in this question. Boxer said that the Secretariat will do its best to discharge its liaison task as effectively as possible but he could see that occasionally a specific representation from CREST might be desirable.

The absence of a participant from the Benelux countries during several consecutive meetings was noted and the Secretariat was asked to investigate the position of the Benelux representation.

1.2 Adoption of the Summary Report of the Thirteenth Meeting

The Summary Report of the Thirteenth Meeting had been issued prior to the Stockholm meeting. Berg proposed that on page 13, lines 16 and 17 should be amended to read as follows

"The agreement will be terminated in April of 1971. It is proposed that the NPY project should continue within the framework of coordinated research programmes involving also other countries than NPY."

With this correction the minutes were adopted by the Committee.

For future minutes the Committee accepted a proposal by Boxer to distribute part B of the minutes also to the IAEA and EANDC observers as well as to the Chairman and Secretary of CREST. *

1.3 Adoption of the Agenda

The agenda was adopted in the form shown in Annex 2.
