Checklist for submission of abstracts of proposed contributions

- _ **abstract submission deadline 30 June 2023**
- _ abstract of proposed contribution
300-500 words in length, in .pdf (preferred) or .docx format
- _ brief biography of presenting author
(max 200 words) in .pdf (preferred) or .docx format

Checklist for participant registration

- _ **participant registration deadline 27 October 2023**
but please register as early as possible
- _ info on your nationality is required to access the WS venue
(you will be asked to present your passport for access)
- _ if you have a presentation, please provide the title of the (accepted) presentation
- _ see below linformation regarding letters of invitation required for U.S. visa applications (if applicable)

Obtaining a Visa

If it is necessary for you to obtain a visa to attend this workshop held in the USA, you can find relevant information about the application process on the following website:

Apply for your Visa well in advance of your travel! Important steps to remember:

- Review your visa status, and find out if you need a U.S. visa or a renewal.
- Review the visa wait times information for interview appointments and visa processing at each embassy and consular section worldwide available on the U.S. Department of State website. Visit the embassy or consular section website where you will apply for your visa to find out how to schedule an interview appointment, pay fees and any other instructions.
- Plan on an interview at the embassy or consulate, which is required for most visa applicants. As part of the visa interview, quick inkless fingerprint scans should be expected. Some visa applications require additional administrative processing, which requires some additional time. Applicants are advised when they apply.

Letter of Invitation

If you require a letter of invitation from the US NRC for your visa application, please register as soon as possible and ensure that the following information is included in your participant registration:

- Your full name (Family name and given name, as it appears on your passport)
- Degree (M.D., Ph.D, etc.)
- Job Title (Professor, Lab Director, etc.)
- Organization
- Full mailing address

You will receive the signed invitation letter in pdf format. In some cases, Visa Offices will not accept electronically transmitted invitation letters.

Note: The United States visa application process can take several months. We strongly encourage travelers to register for the workshop and apply for their visas as early as possible.
